

Looking In The Wrong Dimension Pt3

PSALM 121:1-8

1. I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help.
2. **My help cometh from the LORD**, which made heaven and earth.
3. He will not suffer thy foot to be moved: he that keepeth thee will not slumber.
4. Behold, he that keepeth Israel shall neither slumber nor sleep.
5. The LORD is thy keeper: the LORD is thy shade upon thy right hand.
6. The sun shall not smite thee by day, nor the moon by night.
7. The LORD shall preserve thee from all evil: he shall preserve thy soul.
8. The LORD shall preserve thy going out and thy coming in from this time forth, and even for evermore.

EXODUS 23:20

20. Behold, **I send an Angel before thee**, to keep thee in the way, and to bring thee into the place which I have prepared.

EXODUS 23:27-30

27. **I will send my fear before thee**, and will destroy all the people to whom thou shalt come, and I will make all thine enemies turn their backs unto thee.
28. And **I will send hornets before thee**, which shall drive out the Hivite, the Canaanite, and the Hittite, from before thee.
29. I will not drive them out from before thee in one year; lest the land become desolate, and the beast of the field multiply against thee.
30. **By little and little I will drive them out from before thee**, until thou be increased, and inherit the land.

EXODUS 33:2

2. And **I will send an angel before thee**; and I will drive out the Canaanite, the Amorite, and the Hittite, and the Perizzite, the Hivite, and the Jebusite:

PSALM 124:2-3

2. **If it had not been the LORD who was on our side**, when men rose up against us:
3. Then they had swallowed us up quick, when their wrath was kindled against us:

PSALM 63:7

7. Because thou hast been my help, therefore **in the shadow of thy wings** will I rejoice.

JUDGES 7:20-21

20. And the three companies blew the trumpets, and brake the pitchers, and held the lamps in their left hands, and the trumpets in their right hands to blow withal: and they cried, The sword of the LORD, and of Gideon.

21. And they stood every man in his place round about the camp: and **all the host ran, and cried, and fled.**

I SAMUEL 7:10

10. And as Samuel was offering up the burnt offering, the Philistines drew near to battle against Israel: but **the LORD thundered with a great thunder on that day upon the Philistines, and discomfited them;** and they were smitten before Israel.

II KINGS 3:16-18

16. And he said, Thus saith the LORD, Make this valley full of ditches.

17. For thus saith the LORD, Ye shall not see wind, neither shall ye see rain; yet that valley shall be filled with water, that ye may drink, both ye, and your cattle, and your beasts.

18. And this is but a light thing in the sight of the LORD: **he will deliver the Moabites also into your hand.**

II KINGS 3:22-24

22. And they rose up early in the morning, and the sun shone upon the water, and **the Moabites saw the water on the other side as red as blood:**

23. And they said, This is blood: the kings are surely slain, and they have smitten one another: now therefore, Moab, to the spoil.

24. And when they came to the camp of Israel, the Israelites rose up and smote the Moabites, so that they fled before them: but they went forward smiting the Moabites, even in their country.

II KINGS 6:24-25

24. And it came to pass after this, that Benhadad king of Syria gathered all his host, and went up, and besieged Samaria.

25. And there was a great famine in Samaria: and, behold, they besieged it, until an ass's head was sold for fourscore pieces of silver, and the fourth part of a cab of dove's dung for five pieces of silver.

II KINGS 7:1-7

1. Then Elisha said, Hear ye the word of the LORD; Thus saith the LORD, To morrow about this time shall a measure of fine flour be sold for a shekel, and two measures of barley for a shekel, in the gate of Samaria.
2. Then a lord on whose hand the king leaned answered the man of God, and said, Behold, **if the LORD would make windows in heaven, might this thing be?** And he said, Behold, thou shalt see it with thine eyes, but shalt not eat thereof.
3. And there were four leprous men at the entering in of the gate: and they said one to another, **Why sit we here until we die?**
4. If we say, We will enter into the city, then the famine is in the city, and we shall die there: and if we sit still here, we die also. Now therefore come, and let us fall unto the host of the Syrians: if they save us alive, we shall live; and if they kill us, we shall but die.
5. And they rose up in the twilight, to go unto the camp of the Syrians: and when they were come to the uttermost part of the camp of Syria, behold, there was no man there.
6. For **the Lord had made the host of the Syrians to hear a noise of chariots, and a noise of horses, even the noise of a great host:** and they said one to another, Lo, the king of Israel hath hired against us the kings of the Hittites, and the kings of the Egyptians, to come upon us.
7. Wherefore they arose and fled in the twilight, and left their tents, and their horses, and their asses, even the camp as it was, and **fled for their life.**

II CHRONICLES 20:14-17

14. Then upon Jahaziel the son of Zechariah, the son of Benaiah, the son of Jeiel, the son of Mattaniah, a Levite of the sons of Asaph, came the Spirit of the LORD in the midst of the congregation;
15. And he said, Hearken ye, all Judah, and ye inhabitants of Jerusalem, and thou king Jehoshaphat, Thus saith the LORD unto you, Be not afraid nor dismayed by reason of this great multitude; for **the battle is not yours, but God's.**
16. To morrow go ye down against them: behold, they come up by the cliff of Ziz; and ye shall find them at the end of the brook, before the wilderness of Jeruel.
17. **Ye shall not need to fight in this battle: set yourselves, stand ye still, and see the salvation of the LORD with you,** O Judah and Jerusalem: fear not, nor be dismayed; to morrow go out against them: **for the LORD will be with you.**

II CHRONICLES 20:20-24

20. And they rose early in the morning, and went forth into the wilderness of Tekoa: and as they went forth, Jehoshaphat stood and said, Hear me, O Judah, and ye inhabitants of Jerusalem; **Believe in the LORD your God, so shall ye be established; believe his prophets, so shall ye prosper.**

21. And when he had consulted with the people, he appointed singers unto the LORD, and that should praise the beauty of holiness, as they went out before the army, and to say, Praise the LORD; for his mercy endureth for ever.

22. **And when they began to sing and to praise, the LORD set ambushments** against the children of Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir, which were come against Judah; and they were smitten.

23. For the children of Ammon and Moab stood up against the inhabitants of mount Seir, utterly to slay and destroy them: and when they had made an end of the inhabitants of Seir, **every one helped to destroy another.**

24. And when Judah came toward the watch tower in the wilderness, they looked unto the multitude, and, behold, they were dead bodies fallen to the earth, and **none escaped.**

II CHRONICLES 32:7-8

7. Be strong and courageous, be not afraid nor dismayed for the king of Assyria, nor for all the multitude that is with him: for there be more with us than with him:

8. **With him is an arm of flesh; but with us is the LORD our God to help us, and to fight our battles.** And the people rested themselves upon the words of Hezekiah king of Judah.

HOSEA 1:7

7. But **I will have mercy upon the house of Judah, and will save them by the LORD their God,** and will not save them by bow, nor by sword, nor by battle, by horses, nor by horsemen.

PSALM 20:7

7. **Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the LORD our God.**

I SAMUEL 17:47b

47b. ...**the LORD saveth not with sword and spear: for the battle is the LORD'S,**

PSALM 24:7-8

7. Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors; and the King of glory shall come in.

8. Who is this King of glory? **The LORD strong and mighty, the LORD mighty in battle.**
