JOHN 5:19

CHURCH AGE BOOK

Notice the harmony of the Father and the Son. <u>Jesus never did anything until it was first showed Him by the Father</u>. John 5:19. <u>This harmony is now to exist between the Groom and His bride</u>. He shows her His Word of life. She receives it. She never doubts it. Therefore, nothing can harm her, not even death. For if the seed be planted, the water will raise it up again. Here is the secret of this. The Word is in the bride (as it was in Mary). The bride has the mind of Christ for <u>she knows what He wants done with the Word</u>. She performs the command of the Word in His name for she has "thus saith the Lord." Then the Word is quickened by the Spirit and it comes to pass. Like a seed that is planted and watered, it comes to full harvest, serving its purpose.

Those in the bride do only His will. No one can make them do otherwise. They have 'thus saith the Lord' or they keep still. They know that it has to be God in them doing the works, fulfilling His own Word. He did not complete all His work while in His earthly ministry so now He works in and through the bride.

She knows that, for it was not yet time for Him to do certain things that He must now do. But <u>He will now fulfill through the bride that work which He left for this specific time</u>.

ACTS 16:16-18

- 16. And it came to pass, as we went to prayer, a certain damsel possessed with a spirit of divination met us, which brought her masters much gain by soothsaying:
- 17. The same followed Paul and us, and cried, saying, These men are the servants of the most high God, which shew unto us the way of salvation.
- 18. And this did she many days. But Paul, being grieved, turned and said to the spirit, I command thee in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her. And he came out the same hour.

Paul, a prisoner! See? When God gets you to be His prisoner, then you can't do nothing but what the Spirit says do. Paul, with all of his great intellects, he taught... he was taught by Gamaliel to be a great priest or rabbi, someday. And he had high ambitions. He was intellectually a great man, great authority, great man in the nation. But he had to sacrifice every bit of it, see, to become part of the Word, to express Jesus Christ. He knowed what it was to say...

He had a notion to go over some place, some brethren had called him, but <u>he was</u> <u>forbidden by the Spirit to do his own will</u>. Oh, if--if people half spiritual can pick that up! See? <u>He was forbidden to do his own will</u>. He only could do... "The Spirit forbid me." See? He was a prisoner to Christ.

Then, this little fortuneteller one day, who he knowed, Paul knowed he had power to cast that devil out, **but he could only do it as God willed it**. Day after day she followed him, crying out after him, **but one day the Spirit give him permission**. Then he rebuked her, the spirit that was in her. See? He knowed what it was to be a prisoner.

Some people gets the wrong impression of what the anointing is. Did you ever think of that? When was the greatest anointing ever give to anyone, and what did they do when they had the anointing? The greatest anointing that was ever give to anyone was Jesus Christ. We have the Spirit by measure. He had It without measure.

And one day He entered into the temple, and picked up the Scroll, and read, said, "The Spirit of God is upon Me, for He has anointed Me to preach the acceptable year, to bind up the broken hearts, to heal the sick, give sight to the blind."
